

## **Direct Patient Care Rotation Knowledge Rubric**

The Knowledge Rubric outlines the levels of performance for each assessment criterion in the knowledge domain of the Direct Patient Care Rotation ITAR to which the resident will be assessed throughout the rotation. These levels of performance reflect the stages of learning that an adult (i.e. resident) undertakes when acquiring, interpreting and relating new knowledge. They are ordered from basic (Remembering) to complex (Analyzing) and reflect a cumulative hierarchy whereby the resident has to master the more basic level of performance before moving to the more complex level of performance.

## Moderately Complex Patients or Moderately Complex Drug Therapy Problems

This means that for each direct patient care rotation, regardless of the specialty area of the rotation, the resident is to be assessed on their knowledge, skills, attitudes and behaviours in caring for moderately complex patients and solving moderately complex drug therapy problems.
