

Direct Patient Care Rotation Expectations of Resident Performance

Resident Goal Level of Performance

By the end of the residency year, the resident is expected to be **PROFICIENT** in providing pharmaceutical care to moderately complex patients and in solving moderately complex drug therapy problems.

The table below outlines the goal level of performance for the resident throughout the residency year, based on the number of direct patient care rotations that he or she has completed or is in the process of completing. In some cases, the resident should have achieved a particular level of performance by an early stage in the residency year, meaning that the remainder of the year is focused on refining and further developing the attained level of performance.
